

Hearth is a non-profit corporation whose mission is to end homelessness among the elderly through housing, outreach, prevention, and advocacy. Adults aged 50 and older are the fastest growing segment of the homeless population, with the number expected to triple nationwide by 2030. Nearly 25% of Boston's homeless population is aged 55 or older. All housing operated by Hearth provides a creative array of supportive services that assist residents to age with dignity, regardless of their special medical, mental health, or social needs.
